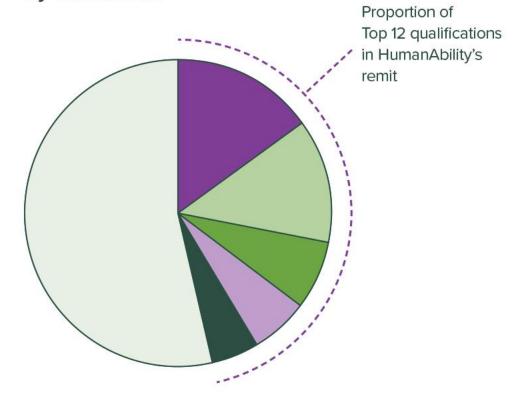

## Increase in traineeships

- Significant growth in traineeships when comparing 2019 commencements with 2023.
  - Certificate III in ECEC 133% increase (12,391 commencements in 2023).
  - Certificate III in Individual Support 115% increase (2231 commencements in 2023)
  - Diploma of School Aged Education and Care (OSHC) 338% increase (359 commencements in 2023)
  - Certificate IV in Mental Health 981% increase (173 commencements in 2023)
  - Certificate III in Health Services Assistance 137% increase (764 commencements in 2023)
  - Combined Cert III and IV in Outdoor Recreation/Leadership 159% increase (223 combined commencements in 2023.

### What we have heard at forums

- Traineeship model works well but needs to be promoted
- Need to increase industry familiarity with traineeship benefits
- Traineeships increase diversity
- There are traineeship pilots that focus on wrap-around services
- There is an interest in **cross-sectoral** traineeships
- The cost to employers is a barrier
- Examples in Victoria of **pre-apprenticeship programs** to improve job readiness and completions

# Training Package review and development:

- Ensure qualifications and skills sets meet industry needs
- Review currency of existing packages
- Identify priority training package reviews
- Identify need for new training packages
- Findings of the Royal Commissions will trigger reviews
