

Challenge 1

'Dirty Trade'



"Manufacturing jobs are not seen as an attractive alternative for school leavers"

"In Australia, we are well placed to develop knowledge intensive, low carbon emissions capability in key segments of global and regional value chains. Australia lacks a clear narrative on 'what we do', leading to a devaluing of manufacturing careers"

Solutions

1. Improving apprenticeship completion rates

 Achieve an accurate assessment of completion rates and the reasons why our apprentices leave our industry

2. Promotional campaigns

 Targeting specific cohorts and promoting the benefits and opportunities of careers in manufacturing. For example, advertising, career expos

3. Changing the work arrangements

- To attract new workers, we need to adapt our employment offering. For example, flexible work, salaries, child care support.
- Learn and earn programs partnering with TAFEs, RTOs, Universities

4. Career development and opportunities

- Create and promote clear pathways for individuals
- Promote the job, for example: helping to build Australia's defence capability or help Australia meet net zero emissions
- School engagement programs
