
Local Recovery Fund

The Local Recovery Fund is available in each Employment Region to support local Activities that are aligned to the priorities identified in each region's Local Jobs Plan.

Activities might include training and re-skilling opportunities that are relevant to local business needs, professional development, individual mentoring, or employment pathway programs.


Launch Into Work

The Launch into Work program supports the delivery of preemployment projects. These projects prepare eligible individuals for specific entry-level roles within a business.

The project is co-designed with the department and the hiring employer. A well-designed project gives individuals the skills, experience and confidence they need to start work. Projects include:

- training
- practical activities in the workplace
- mentoring.

Apprenticeship Careers Australia (ACA) obtained a contract with the Commonwealth Government department DEWR until June 2028 to run "Launch into Work" program that supports new entrants into workforce/sector from targeted labour shortage areas.



Happow Hustle Hub - Youth Pre-Employment


Using a holistic approach and hands-on activities, we aimed to support young people to plan, engage, and understand the opportunities they have going forward into their futures.
